Green-Schools Travel work each year with schools across Ireland to develop, fund and coordinate active and sustainable mobility initiatives. In 2021 we are working with 170 schools on the Travel programme, with a mix of classroom-based workshops and outdoors training and events. To overcome difficulties due to COVID-19-related school closures, we adopted a total shift towards online engagement with new educational resources for students to do at home and the organisation of several virtual events. We ran a very successful #andshecycles Ambassador programme, which enables secondary school teenage girls to develop #andshecycles campaigns to encourage and enable more girls cycling to school. We celebrated Bike Week and Clean Air Week with an online digital campaign, both campaigns were highly engaging

The right of citizens to breathe clean air provoked much scrutiny across the many environmental agendas which were ongoing during the month of November.

During 2020 Green-Schools Travel Officers worked on the design and implementation of a new initiative: The Cycle Bus Network, established by Green-Schools to support the growing number of cycle buses nationwide.

Cycle Buses are parent/guardian/community-led initiatives whereby several parents and volunteers lead groups of cycling primary school students to one or more schools. Green-Schools Travel team support the development of Cycle Buses as they have a huge potential in encouraging group cycling on the way to schools, promoting exercise and supporting sustainable mobility.

Green-Schools researcher researcher, Dr. Robert Egan published his study on the findings of Green-Schools' research into the uptake of cycling among young women, which explored the experiences and perceptions of cycling among teenage girls and boys in Ireland. Through focus groups conducted with boys and girls in 2020 and 2021 students explored their experiences with cycling. In seeking to understand why teen girls do not cycle in the same numbers as their male peers, Green-Schools found that

At present we have not been able to secure a school to participate on foreign travel trips due to COVID-19, however we engage with over 170 schools each year on average to deliver a sustainable mobility programme. We hope that by next season we can be in a better position to travel.



Green-Schools works with a number of Special Schools across Ireland, as well as working with a number of students who have additional needs. During our walkability audits, we identify poor infrastructure which does not support easy access for those with a reduced mobility. These audits are shared to the Local Authority and recommendations are made for improvements. In September, as part of European Mobility Week, Green-Schools promotes Make Way Day and raises awareness of the problems caused by things left on the footpath, i.e. hine illegal narking hikee narked on footnathe etc.


Strong social groups were created due to Erasmus activities, namely the foreign exchange trips between St. Tiernan's Community school and students from Spain, Lithuania and Denmark






There should have been more funding for salaries the administration of the project in each country




Highly exciting and engaging for all!

The tricky one is international travel - as previously discussed. Rail-and-sail is the way to go to reduce emissions, but it will add on 1 or 2 days per trip....




To have editing permission to update the blog, but only for coordinators.
